A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Cascade Christian Church,

One of the things I am very grateful for is to be part of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). We are not a large denomination in Michigan, and are not as well known as Methodists, Lutherans, or Baptists. Small as we are, we have a mighty message of the grace of God for a hurting world. This week and next I am going to share some of the characteristic beliefs of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). In January I will be holding some Wednesday night classes on our denomination, including the importance of communion and baptism, the history of Cascade Christian Church, and will have information on church membership.

Two basic concepts have marked and shaped the life of the Christian Church (Disciple of Christ) from our beginnings in the 19th century American frontier:

First, we believe that the oneness of the church is essential to God's mission in the world.

A passion for Christian unity was one of the primary motivations that began our church. One of our early leaders was Barton Stone, a Presbyterian minister who broke with his denominational heritage when Christians were excluded from the Lord's Supper. He referenced Ephesians 4:4-6 There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. Stone believed unity of all Christians was an essential element for effective witness and evangelism on the American frontier, and declared, "Let Christian unity be our polar star." In this he urged that our one-ness in Christ be the point from which we take our bearings and chart our course as a church.

Others who joined Stone in this movement of unity included Thomas and Alexander Campbell, father and son ministers who immigrated from Ireland to found what became known as the "Disciples" – urging Christian to simply follow Jesus and not exclude others by "fencing off the Table", or by use of creedal conscriptions before a person could take communion. The Campbells believed that "The church of Christ upon earth is essentially intentionally, and constitutionally one." To be a divisive Christian was, in their eyes, a betray of God's promise of oneness in the sacrifice of Jesus upon the cross, and a denial of the Gospel itself. Which leads to our second core belief.

Second, the sole authority for the church's life is the Bible, with particular emphasis on the New Testament as the primary source of revelation of God in Jesus Christ.

The movement that Stone and the Campbells lead became known as the Restoration Movement, with the desire to restore in the church the New Testament principles, especially those found in Acts 2:42-47. "No creed but Christ, no book but the Bible" became one of the ways this was expressed, as well as "Where the Scriptures speak, we speak. Where the Scriptures are silent, we are silent."

The two foundations of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) can be seen in anyone of our worship services – there is the centrality of the Lord's Supper, and the preaching of the Word of God from the Holy Bible. All who profess Christ as Lord are welcomed at the Table, and all are encouraged to read the Scriptures for themselves. Unity and scripture, that is a big part of who we are as a church. I hope you'll join us in worship in-person or on-line. The Table is open to you, and we'd love to have you explore

SUNDAY SCHOOL


This year we are working our way through the whole Bible. Come right up to the youth room at 11:00 AM (we will not be dismissing from Church). We hope to see you there!
