A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Cascade Christian Church,

The Psalmist writes in Psalm 96:

- 1 Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth.
- 2 Sing to the Lord, praise his name; proclaim his salvation day after day.
- 3 Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous deeds among all peoples.

My guess is we all have some favorite songs and artists from Johnny Cash or the Beatles, or maybe Taylor Swift or Adele, or Coldplay or Mozart. You probably have some favorite hymns or praise songs as well. People always sing out with hymns like "Joyful. Joyful We Adore Thee" and "Amazing Grace" and sing out with praise songs like "Reckless Love" and "Revelation Song". Music is one of the languages we use to speak to God, and we are so blessed at Cascade Christian to have Worship Leader Jacob Relph and Organists Nancy Gaskell and Carol Rienstra. And thank you as well to all of the volunteer musicians and techs who work with them to bring music to our worship services. It has been wonderful to sing together again in church as we praise our God.

As much as we might have favorite songs and hymns, sometimes it is good to learn a new song. Jacob has brought many new songs to us – and continues to do so. Robert Achterhof brought us "In Remembrance" and Tim Murtaugh taught us "Come Share the Lord". New music brings new life into our worship gatherings just as our old favorite bring us comfort and joy.

10.24.2021 SERMON: PEACE, BE STRONG NOW, BE STRONG

So we have been working our way through the book of Daniel this autumn, reading about how to be courageous in difficult times. We've seen how it takes courage to know who you are, and that God can use you just as you are, it takes courage to stand for Christ, it takes courage to admit it when you're wrong, it takes courage to look within and see what God is writing on your wall, and it takes courage to face your own lions. The book of Daniel was written while Israel was in exile in Babylon. Daniel helps us see that God was with his people even when they were far from home, away from all that had meaning, when they were unable to worship and offer sacrifices to God as they had done in the Temple of Jerusalem. As long as they walked humbly and faithfully before him, God continued to work among His people and bless them. And as far as we know Daniel never returned to his homeland.

Through the events and dreams in the book of Daniel we see how God encouraged Israel and revealed to them that no matter how bad it gets in this world, God is not finished. He will eventually bring about His heavenly kingdom and it will ultimately overcome all the earthly kingdoms and rulers of this world. This is the message for us today. This is a message of peace, and to be strong, to have courage and be at peace and be strong now.

Daniel is not just the narrative of God's people in Babylon, it is also a book of visions and revelations of what is to come. People have had a lot of theories about what Daniel 7-12 is about, but I think all would agree that it is concerning the destiny of God's people. These dreams and visions of Daniel are rarely studied in some churches, and wildly misinterpreted in others. But God put this message in the Bible for us to learn from so we should not ignore this. Let's ask God to show us what He wants us to see as we look at His word.

So the second half of Daniel is about dreams. When was the last time you had a scary or troubling dream? Do you remember what was scary about it? When we study Daniel we hear about a lot of scary dreams – King Nebuchadnezzar and the huge image of gold, silver, brass, iron, and clay that was destroyed by a stone that hurtled through the air and smashed into the statue, breaking it until all the pieces are like dust in the wind. Then the stone became a mountain that grew until it fills the entire earth. This dream meant that earthly kingdoms fail, and God will prevail. In chapter 4 Nebuchadnezzar has another dream and this time Daniel tells him how God will humble him and break his pride. Nebuchadnezzar would become like an animal in his mind and actions until he humbled himself and recognized that God sets up rulers as God chooses. King Nebuchadnezzar ended up praising the God of Israel as the Most High God. After Nebuchadnezzar, Daniel served under other Kings – Belshazzar, Dairus, and Cyrus. Then, as a wiseman and counselor to kings, Daniel himself has some dreams.

Listen to chapter 7:1-3: In the first year of Belshazzar king of Babylon, Daniel had a dream, and visions passed through his mind as he was lying in bed. He wrote down the substance of his dream.

2 Daniel said: "In my vision at night I looked, and there before me were the four winds of heaven churning up the great sea. 3 Four great beasts, each different from the others, came up out of the sea.

This dream or vision could better be called a nightmare. The Great Sea represents the countries of the world. And the four beasts are four great nations. Daniel first sees a lion with eagle's wings – an emblem of Babylon, but the wings get plucked off, and the lion becomes like a man, this sound like what happened to Nebuchadnezzar. Then from the sea comes a bear with 3 ribs in its mouth – the bear represents the Medes and Persians. They were a massive nation – huge, like a bear, large, but also slow and sluggish, the ribs represent the nations they conquer – Egypt, Lydia, and Babylon. Next out of the waters rises a leopard with four heads and four wings – this is the nation of Greece, and the leopard is an emblem of the swift movement and fast conquests of Alexander the Great.

10.17.2021 SERMON: IT TAKES COURAGE FACE YOUR LIONS

The last beast is not identified, other than great and terrible with iron teeth, crushing everyone under foot, and it had 10 horns. This is Rome, who will rule with an iron fist. And yet, all of these mighty kingdoms will fall, one after another. And then – there is a little horn, the stuff of nightmares, it had eyes, and a mouth, and is full of pride, it boasts, and is defiant. This is Satan, the evil one. But then the Ancient of Days, God takes His seat, his throne is flaming with fire, thousands upon thousands, ten thousand times ten thousand stand before him – like in Revelation. Satan keeps boasting, then the Son of Man appears.

Daniel 7:13-14:13 "In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. 14 He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all nations and peoples of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed.

This is Jesus. Then Daniel tells us that the saints of the Most High will receive His Kingdom and possess it forever, Daniel says to us yes, forever, and ever. So how are we doing? Did you get all that? Is this a little too weird or out there from what we are used to? Do any of you get the urge to just skip over it and go on to something else more familiar? I believe we need to resist that urge. We need to ask for God's guidance and humble ourselves and listen. Do you get the point? Who wins? The saints! But Daniel goes on to show that it's not that easy. Evil is strong, and even the saints must endure before receiving the kingdom. Every week I hear your suffering, how hard the pandemic has been, how you can't talk about this with family and friends who see things differently than you, how challenging things are not only here, but worldwide. This has been a hard time for you, saints, and think of the suffering of our brother and sister saints in Haiti, or Detroit. Suffering is part of sainthood.

But look at Jesus! He suffered. He endured hardship, betrayal, rejection from his own family, pain, torture, abandonment, and then a criminal's death. He tells us to follow Him that His yoke is easy, and his burden is light, because he carries it with us, but he also tells us to pick up our own cross. When Jesus faced those who put him to death, the high priest rose among them and asked him point blank, "Are you the Messiah, the son of the blessed One?" Jesus answered: "I am, and you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of the Power and coming in the clouds of glory." That's what Daniel saw, the Son of man coming in the clouds, Jesus who was given dominion and glory and a kingdom that includes all peoples, nations, and languages. His dominion is an everlasting, endless, it will never pass away. Satan cannot destroy the Kingdom of Jesus, no matter how much he boasts or is defiant.

This is your kingdom this is where you belong, where Jesus the Christ rules and reigns. We who follow him are his chosen ones, his holy nation, his royal priesthood, the people belonging to God. That is who you and I are in Jesus Christ! That is who we become by his grace and adoption through the Holy Spirit when we trust him and are baptized in his name. May God open our eyes to see who He is and may God strengthen us to face whatever comes our way. Daniel's vision speaks of judgment and justice.

We are invited by God Himself to do our part to include every country, language, tribe, all of the people of earth. Our job, our part, is to be faithful and invite others in, and Jesus will sort them out. And when the judgment comes, as it surely will, the evil powers will crash down into eternal damnation, and as the dust settles, we'll be standing, rejoicing, enjoying God's glory and presence throughout the eternal ages. So let's be faithful. Let's be willing to stand, and by the grace of God we will. No matter what, we will stand and include others.

10.17.2021 SERMON: IT TAKES COURAGE FACE YOUR LIONS

Daniel continues to have dreams and visions – and the words are given to you in the Bible to encourage you – Daniel 10:18-19 Again the one who looked like a man touched me and gave me strength. 19 "Do not be afraid, you who are highly esteemed," he said. "Peace! Be strong now; be strong." When he spoke to me, I was strengthened and said, "Speak, my lord, since you have given me strength."

God is giving you His peace. I think we need to pause here and think about that. God says peace. Don't be afraid, be strong now, be strong, and have peace. In so many ways, we see things differently than God does. We see the sickness; God sees the healing. We see the troubles; God sees the triumph. We so easily see the challenges, while God sees growing strength and resolve. This is a time for peace and for strength, strength to resist evil, strength to help others, strength to pray for those in need, strength to be generous and full of grace. And even strength to confess the ways we have fallen away from God, because that is the road to inner peace.

As the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) we believe faith and reason, faith in our God who is with us, who is always with us, even when we can't see far ahead or even see at all. And reason, that God has given us minds to think, given us the will to do things to glorify Him and build His Kingdom, and to see that working together always gets us further than working apart. We might be dismayed by the power, evil, self-centeredness, the greed and pride, but God knows this evil is only temporary. Kingdoms will rise and fall, but God is sovereign, all powerful, endless in Hs love and grace, and God has written the ending. Evil cannot endure, it can't stand against the power of the Almighty.

Even as Daniel had more nightmares of the evil one, of Satan, who exalts himself in these visions, Satan cannot stand, and is defeated. Daniel 11:45 says of the evil one – **Yet he will come to his end, and no one will help him.** God wins, that is how it ends. And while we have this assurance, we are not yet through the journey. It is hard right now, but we are not alone. God has commanded His angels concerning us, to protect us, to help us, to go to battle for us. God's word continues in Daniel 12:1-4 saying this of God's angels and the archangel Michael:

"At that time Michael, the great prince who protects your people, will arise. There will be a time of distress such as has not happened from the beginning of nations until then. But at that time your people—everyone whose name is found written in the book—will be delivered. 2 Multitudes who sleep in the dust of the earth will awake: some to everlasting life, others to shame and everlasting contempt. 3 Those who are wise will shine like the brightness of the heavens, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever. 4 But you, Daniel, roll up and seal the words of the scroll until the time of the end. Many will go here and there to increase knowledge."

Today we increase in our knowledge, knowing God fights for us, God is with us, God has your name written in the book of life and on the palms of his hands. And in God's hands you shine, like a star. You've had the courage to look at this wisdom in Daniel, and Daniel's vision isn't so much about timetables when prophecy will occur, or the date of the return of Jesus- it is a vision of heart change – heart attitude towards the Lord. It takes courage to face a Living God, courage to be numbered among the saints, courage to repent and let God be God. What rings out loud and clear in every chapter of this book is that God is sovereign. God overrules and eventually will overcome all evil.

So be at peace, and be strong. This is encouragement for people living in challenging times, whether it was the people of God in Babylon or you and me right now. God is at war, friends, at war with evil and without a doubt God will overcome evil. This message in Daniel brought God's people comfort in Babylon, and it brings us comfort now. The Ancient of Days knows what He is doing. So for you and me, peace, be strong now, be strong. Amen and amen.
